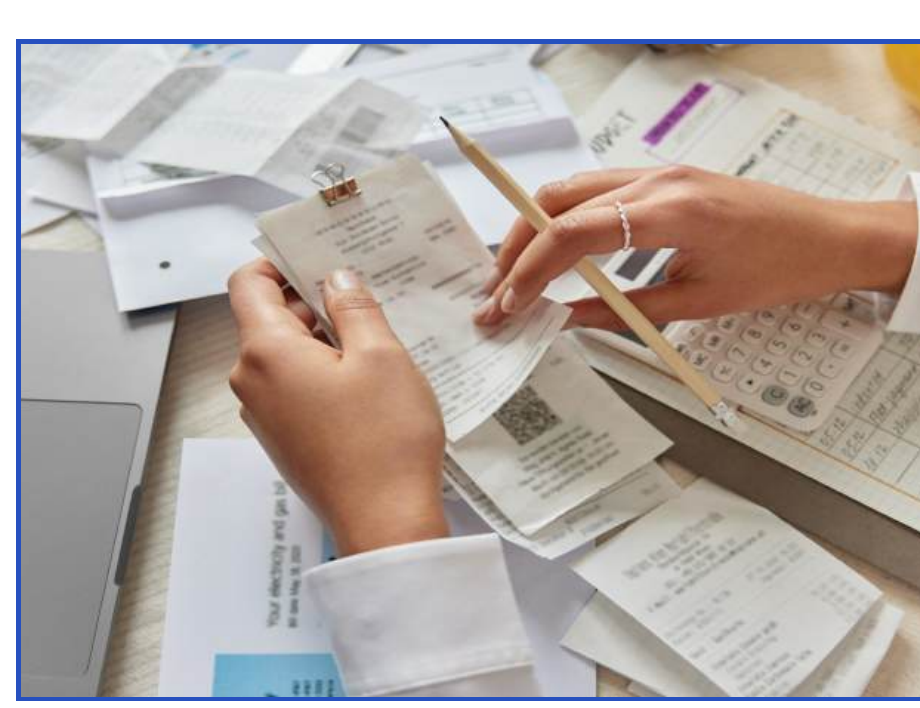
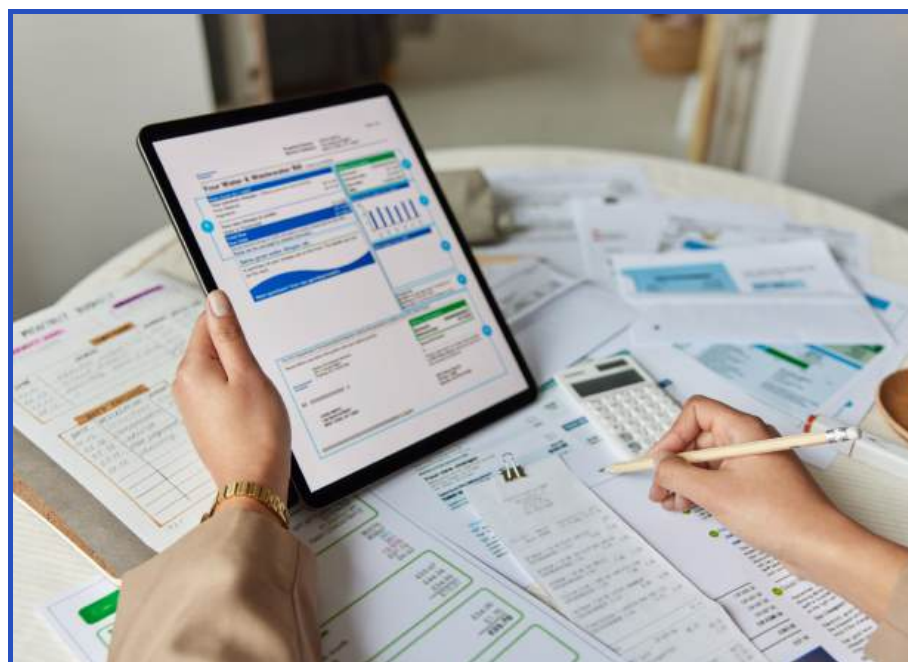

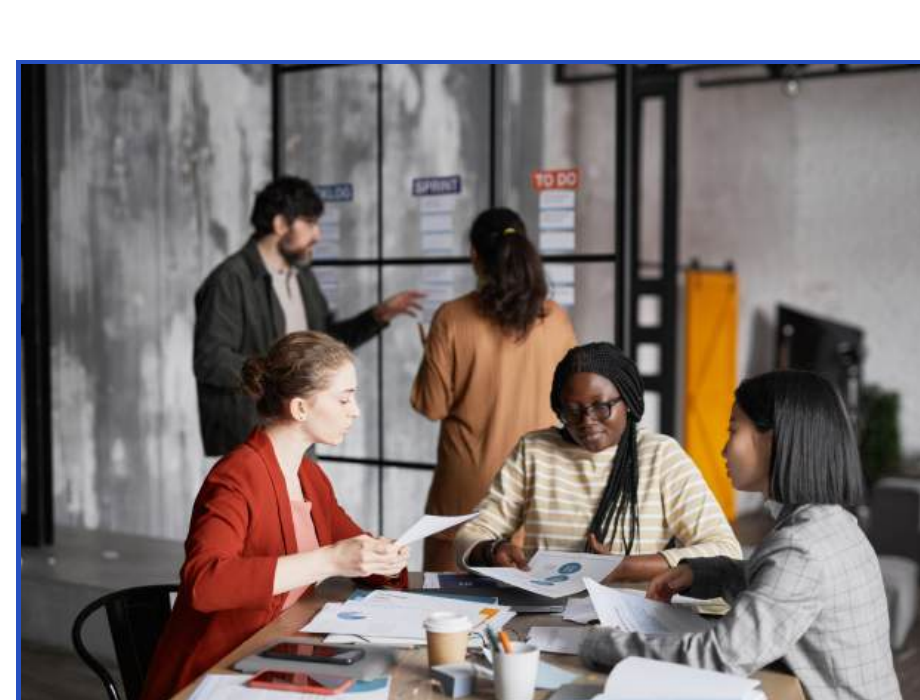


4. Manual Work Signals That Your System Is Falling Behind

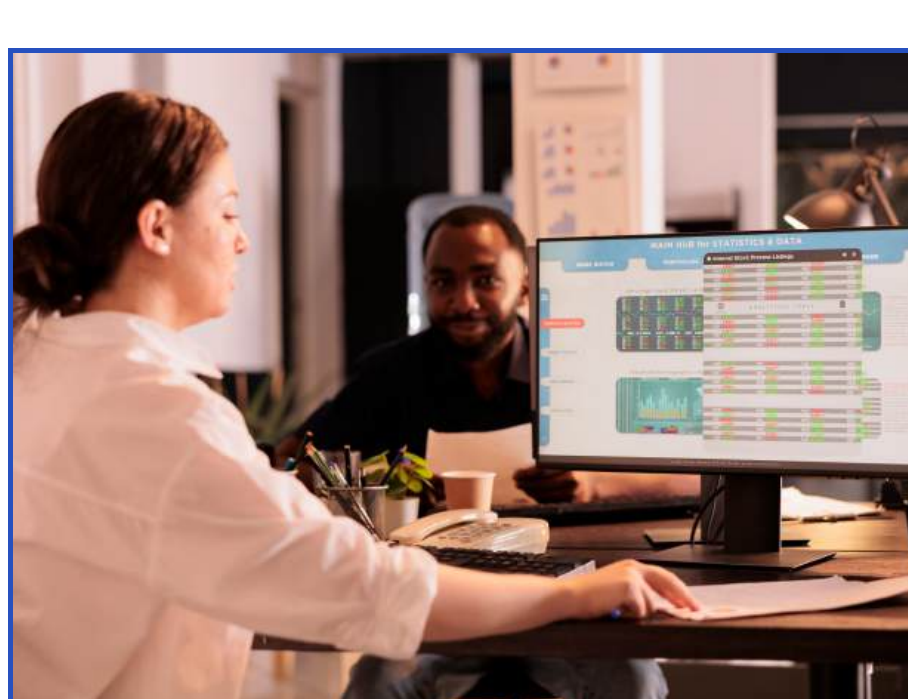


6. Client Management Matters More Than Most Offices Realize
